#### OPPORTUNITIES ABOUND

The Fall Season always brings about numerous requests for Entry Level Clinics as well as Recertification Clinics. There are tournaments everywhere and a lot of opportunities. The SRC is trying to find new and innovative ways to continue the development of our officials. We have always had an Assessor of the Day Program, administered by the SDA. An assessor is dispatched to a location to perform developmental assessments on various individuals identified by the local administrators. However, starting during this Fall season, the State is introducing a Coach-Mentor model, administered by ARA Cedric Thomas, to send people to requesting organizations to coach our referees from the newest to the most experienced. These are specifically selected people who will use modern coaching techniques to give each referee new tools to improve their on -and off-field performances. The program is in the beginning stages and will continue to develop over the next few years! All of these efforts are to better serve all areas of the state and our refereeing community.



#### **NEW UNIFORMS FOR 2019**

The May 1, 2016 NWSL matches marked the debut of the latest version of the Official U.S. Soccer Referee Uniform. Officiating crews in Boston, Chicago and Seattle wore redesigned kits featuring the recently-launched U.S. Soccer Referee Program logo.

Official Sports International, the exclusive Referee Uniform Supplier of U.S. Soccer, incorporated direct feedback from referees at all levels during the redesign process. The new kit features a number of improvements including a sleeker design that is now available in both men's and women's cuts for the first time.

The uniforms are available to the referee community for purchase in Pro and Economy versions. The uniform will be sold in five colors, with red, yellow and green available first, while blue and black will be released around the holidays. The current official jersey uniform style can still be worn during matches through 2018.
