Some Areas Noted During Open Cup — Every Game is Someone's World Cup!

- * Referee with confidence; keep your head up, don't drop it during dead-ball situations; you may need to see something
- Establish positive eye contact with your referee crew especially during dead ball situations
- * Be very careful of flag mechanics to include only those signals in *The Guide to Procedures* and never clip your flag (hold on to the end) during substitutions
- * Stay in direct alignment with the second-to-the-last defender or the ball when serving as an Assistant Referee



* Don't get involved in ball watching as an AR....your primary responsibility is Offside!

Why Do I Need to Check Player/Team Credentials?

There are several adult leagues forming in Alabama. Some of these leagues have been in good standing with the Alabama Soccer Association for several years such as the Huntsville Adult Soccer League (HASL). However, some of our start-up leagues have not registered with the state and paid the required fees. Now, why does that matter to the referees? Remember, we are independent contractors that can work for whomever we want. However, you want to keep the following in mind......

If you work for sanctioned or recognized leagues, those with rosters and player passes, you can be assured that if there is some sort of incident that occurs on the field, you are covered by the USSF umbrella insurance. This could protect you from a frivolous lawsuit from an incident that occurs on the field.

The reason we require a certain number of recertification hours and a recertification test for our referees is to ensure that we meet all the requirements to keep our referees covered by that same insurance. However, you have a responsibility to ensure that you meet those requirements, attending a full-length clinic and passing the test with a minimum of 80%, as well as working for those leagues that "do things right". Of course, the decision is yours but you need to keep this in mind when someone offers you an assignment and says, "I approve you working here even though we don't have all the paperwork."
